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There Are Cranes Across The Skyline As Our Precinct Evolves

The next decade will see significant changes in the visual landscape of our Precinct with towering building projects bringing more residents, additional workers, new businesses and greater economic opportunities than ever before.

Here's a brief update on what to expect over the next ten years.

Auta Group's Victoria Tower at 36 Grote Street will be Adelaide's 4th tallest building. Scheduled for completion in September next year, the 37-storey tower will have nine levels offering commercial tenancies and 285 apartments ranging from studio to penthouse options.

Across the road, work has been underway on the \$400M Market Square redevelopment since June 2023.

This 39-storey development will offer a retail and commercial mix that is to include a childcare centre, luxury residences, a hotel and a garden retreat as well as activated public spaces.

Treehouse Hotels will open its first Australian location here offering a restaurant, bar and street-front café showcasing local produce, an indoor–outdoor event space plus fitness and wellness facilities. Commercial and first stage apartments are due to be finished in 2025, with retail and hotel components on track for completion in 2026.

At the Precinct's Western end, the former Australia Post property (bounded by Grote, Blenheim and Gouger Streets), is to house a \$1.25B multitower development. This is to be built in stages over a decade.

The Gurner Group with landowner Kennards Self Storage, plans five towers ranging from 15 to 28 storeys incorporating 600 apartments and



a 16-storey hotel, a wellness centre plus office, retail and hospitality spaces.

Over on Franklin Street, the former bus terminal site is slated for a multi-million dollar affordable housing project.

To be called Tapangka, the development will transform the area with twin towers: one of 18-storeys, the other 26. It is to include a 208 room hotel, plus commercial and retail spaces and will house some 1,000 people.

Plans were also recently lodged with Planning SA for a proposed luxury apartment block at 162-168 Gouger Street.
